The House with Chicken Legs

Marinka longs to change her destiny and sets out to break free from her grandmother's footsteps, but her house has other ideas...

The Outlaws Scarlett & Browne

England has been radically changed by a series of catastrophes - large cities have disappeared, and London has been replaced by a lagoon. The surviving population exists in fortified towns where they cling to traditional ways but danger is never far away. Scarlett McMain is an outlaw - a shoot-first-ask-questions-later kind of outlaw. Masquerading as evacuees, they travel to Elysium Hall, as they suspect that one of the wealthy family that lives there is passing information to Germany. If they can prove it, the Ministry will have to take them on. But there are more secrets at Elysium Hall than May or Eric could ever have imagined.

Brightstorm (Book 1 in a series)

Arthur and Maudie Brightstorm receive word in Lontown that their famous explorer father has died in a failed expedition to reach the world's southernmost point. He's also accused of stealing. The twins don't believe the news so when they hear of a new attempt to reach South Polaris they are keen to join it. It's their only hope of learning the truth ... and salvaging their family's reputation. As the winged ship Aurora sets sail, the twins must keep their wits about them and prove themselves worthy of the rest of the crew. But will Arthur and Maudie find the answers they want?
